It can be hard to imagine opening up your home to a stranger. What kind of person will they be? How will it affect me and my family and our routines? What will we do with them every day? It seems so long of a commitment — what if we don't get along? These are the types of questions that we asked ourselves when considering whether or not to host a French Intern through LNFI's Intern Program. They were all rational thoughts, but underlying the concerns was the exciting idea of what we

might learn and experience by sharing our culture with someone from another country. And we wanted to support a program that means so much to our daughter's school. So we signed up. What happened? Well, we got matched to an intern – Jeanne Etelain. It was a nervous excitement as we prepared for her arrival! But we tried to imagine how much harder it would be to leave what is familiar to go on an adventure in a new country. And it was fun to imagine our life here as something foreign to another person and made a list of all of our favorite things that we would love to share.

It turned out that we had much more in common than we imagined! We all loved good food and shared lots of time in the kitchen exchanging recipes and food culture. We loved the outdoors and ran together, hiked together, biked together and more. Jeanne's English began to sound amazing and she and my daughter would speak French together regularly. She shared French stories and movies. In short, we just loved spending time together, and, before long, Jeanne was just a normal part of our family. By the time our 5 months were over, we found ourselves sad that we would have to say goodbye. We still miss her, but stay in touch regularly. And I know we have made an amazing friendship that will last the rest of our lives.
