Give to the Max – November 16. Give to the Max Day is the largest single fundraising event in Minnesota for non-profits and schools. Now is the time to reach out to friends, neighbors, and family and ask them to make a donation to support our kids and our school. **Kermesse - Save the Date!** Kermesse is tentatively planned for Friday, May 14, 2018. A kermesse in France is an end-of-year community-building fundraiser for the whole school and is similar to a school carnival. The whole school will be involved, so the school will need lots of help to make it successful! This event went really last year (the first year LNFI had a kermesse). Planning will soon be starting with the teacher committee for the Kermesse celebration. Watch for a backpack flyer soon to see how you can be involved or let your student's teacher know you would like to help.

Box Tops for Education. Thank you to all the families who turned in Box Tops! Almost \$250 worth of Box Tops were collected! If your student turned in 100 Box Tops, a \$10 book fair certificate was sent home with the student. (There will also be a list of students at the book fairs.) When you turn in Box Tops, don't forget to label the bag with the teacher's and student's names.
